Teaching & Learning Method in a B-School: A Case of XIMB

Abhishek, a fresh graduate from IIT Madras was totally lost after attending the first class of the MBA programme, 2007-09 in XIMB. He had heard of the well known Professor of Economics whose class he had just attended. While Abhishek was very pleased to be in the class of this Professor, he was perplexed with what had happened in the class. After the short introduction to a story of a company, there were moments of chaos when everybody in the class wanted to speak, and there were also long periods of silence to some of the questions raised by the Professor. Instead of giving answers to the questions raised by the students, the Professor rather raised more questions to the questions asked. Abhishek wondered whether he had come to the right place to learn. Abhishek had an offer for a PhD on Robotics with partial scholarship in a US university and he wondered whether he should reconsider this offer.

Abhishek experienced similar fee lings of chaos and disorder with little answers from the other professors in marketing, finance, decision sciences, and general management courses. To add to this, every professor had given a bunch of reading materials for every session. For every class, there would be a descriptive story; what they called as a Case and then one or two associated readings. Abhishek, like most other students felt that the associated readings though tough, explained important theories and principles but the stories; the so called cases were easy to read but had little substance. What was the big thing about a Case?

Except for a few sessions in several courses, where the professors explained some concepts and theories, most of the sessions were case based discussions. The professors often raised questions and left the class to find answers. The professors expected the students to talk more than themselves in the class. This was quite contrary to what Abhishek and the others in his class had experienced in the ir previous undergraduate and post graduate studies. How would we learn if the professor explained so little in the class and let the students discuss it out? Some students even remarked "If we were to discuss among ourselves then why should we come to a class; we

could as well do that in our hostels or elsewhere." Some students were further critical on whether the professors deserved the high salaries for simply raising questions in the class? Was this technique employed by the professors who were ill prepared for the class or those who had other engaging consultancy and training programmes and had no time to prepare for the classes? "Preparing and updating the lectures for each session would obviously take more time" said a class representative of the class wisely.

XIMB had a very good library with a large collection of books, journals, magazines and other classics in the field of management studies (see Exhibit 1). However, most professors did not provide or follow any textbooks in particular. They rather distributed bunches of photocopied materials (see Exhibit 2). What a waste of valuable paper!, some students commented Others thought, instead of the photocopies, students could be given more than one text book for each subject. The air conditioned library operated between 8.00 A.M. and 10.00 P.M. everyday and at times, it operated round the clock. While most were happy and proud about the infrastructure and facility, some thought it was a useless expenditure incurred.

The classrooms were also different from what the students were accustomed to in the undergraduate colleges of engineering, science, arts, or commerce prior to getting into XIMB. The classes were like an amphitheatre and some classes even had swivel chairs. The classrooms were equipped with the all the modern teaching aids: lap tops, internet connection, LCD projector, OHP projector, public address system, screens for projection, large board, etc. (see Exhibit 3). However, most of the time, the professors used the large boards that covered the entire length of the front wall.

While some students enjoyed seeing the professor working hard to write in every part of the board, some wondered why the professor did not use the technology available in the classroom. A student remarked 'The notes could be written in power point slides and then projected onto the board using the LCD that is already set-up in the classroom. Instead of spending time writing in the board, the professor could answer a few questions in the class. The professors usually took time to write most of the key points discussed by the class. Sometimes the professor echo ed strongly some comments or statements made by the students."

Most students were used to being evaluated through a single university examination at the end of the academic year or at the end of a semester, i.e. every six months. Evaluation through practicals or dissertation was very limited. In XIMB, the evaluation & grading was different

too. Evaluation was continuous and consisted of many components with a lot of emphasis on class participation, class discussions, assignments and group projects (see Exhibit 4). Certain components appeared to be too subjective. The weightage given to class participation seemed to be disproportionately high. In courses with major emphasis on group work and case discussions; the weightage on class participation was even higher. It seemed that those who could be verbose were rewarded more marks. Why was talking in the class given so much importance? Some students in an effort to speak more actually wasted class time with their undeveloped thoughts. How did the professor evaluate such kind of participation?

Students were not used to the grading system; the so called relative grading. Although Abhishek was used to relative grading in IIT Madras, most others in his batch were used to the percentage system. He tried to figure out, how would the professor grade the students if the whole class decided to perform poorly on a particular course? Would there be some basic minimum pass mark?

As MBA aspirants do, Abhishek's batchmates too had read about MBA education and life in a MBA school from various sources like the internet, blogs, pagalguy.com, and also heard from people in the coaching centres. A XIMBian had written about life in XIMB and had posted it in pagalguy.com (see Exhibit 5). For many who had read this; life at XIMB seemed hectic but actually was relaxed like in a youth camp cramped with activities. It did not suggest much on learning outcomes and hence did not match either the claims of the coaching centres or their own experience in the first term of the MBA programme 2007-09 in XIMB. What then had changed?

Abhishek's batch mates were reluctantly falling in line with the weird teaching and learning practices in XIMB. Most of them were willing to go through whatever it takes with the hope that they will get employed in multinational companies with big fat salaries within 20 months of joining XIMB. They enthusiastically looked forward to the announcements of the Placement Office, the Placement Coordinator and counted their days to leave the XIMB campus. By the end of first Term, though Abhishek began to discover and learn many things on his own and was also among the top 10 of the class, he still wondered if the weird teaching and learning method adopted by the professors in XIMB was just a business with hype or it had some strong logic and philosophy.

Questions for Discussion

- 1. What dilemmas did Abhishek face as he began his journey of education in XIMB?
- 2. What do you think has been the learning style of Abhishek?
- 3. What are the issues about professors that troubles Abhsihek in XIMB?
- 4. What are the teacher(s) trying to achieve in the class discussions?
- 5. What are the concrete issues with reading materials and class room discussion?
- 6. What are the issues in evaluation and grading that the classmates of Abhishek are confused about?
- 7. Is Abhishek finding any difference between popular opinions and descriptions about the learning environment in XIMB (as depicted in the internet, coaching centres, etc.) and the actual experience?
- 8. How much should Abhishek and his fellow students rely on the suggestions and orientation of their seniors in XIMB?
- 9. How does the learning environment in XIMB add value to the students' thinking abilities?
- 10. On what basis do the companies that recruit students from XIMB and other institutes of management justify high salaries?


