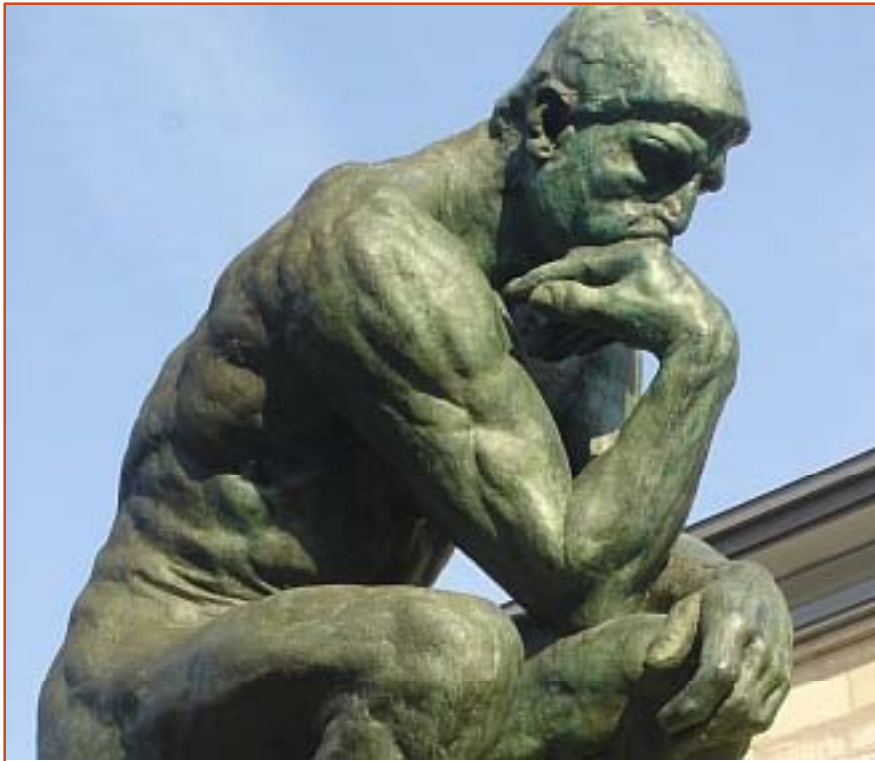

# The Dominant Paradigm

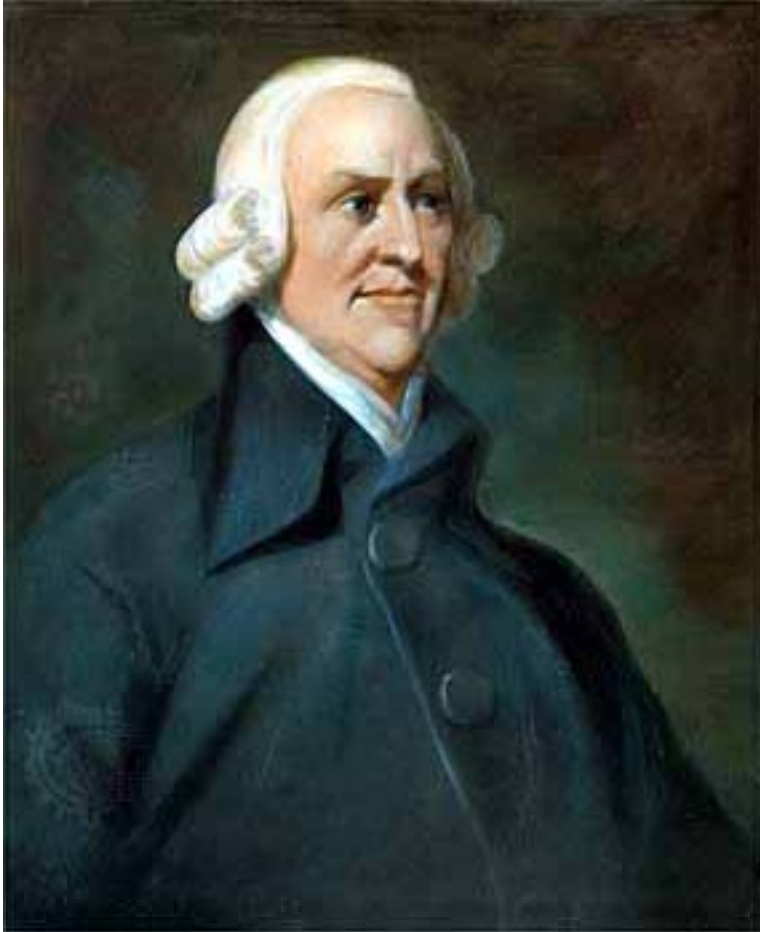
- The paradigm of competition –primacy to self interest & survival of the “ fittest”

# The Theory of Moral Sentiment

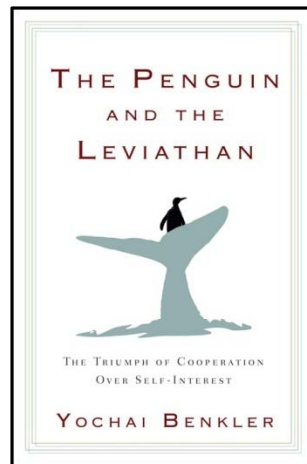

Stack Overflow is a programming Q & A site that's free. 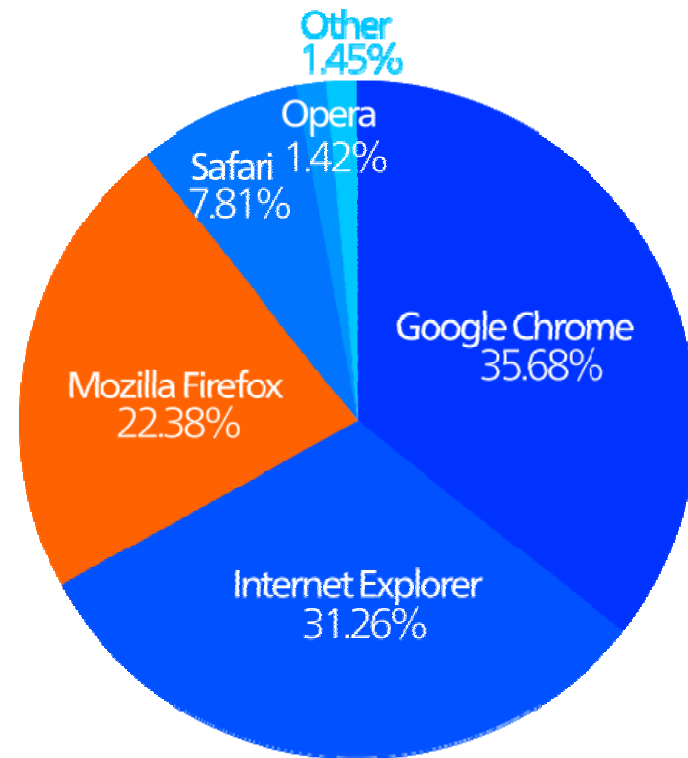

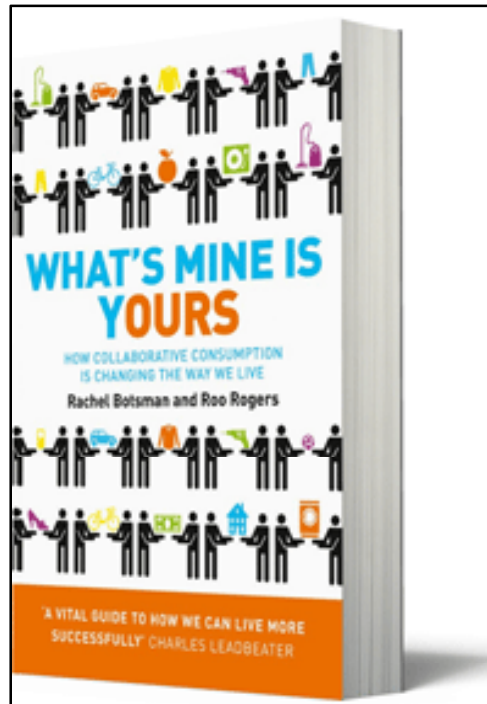

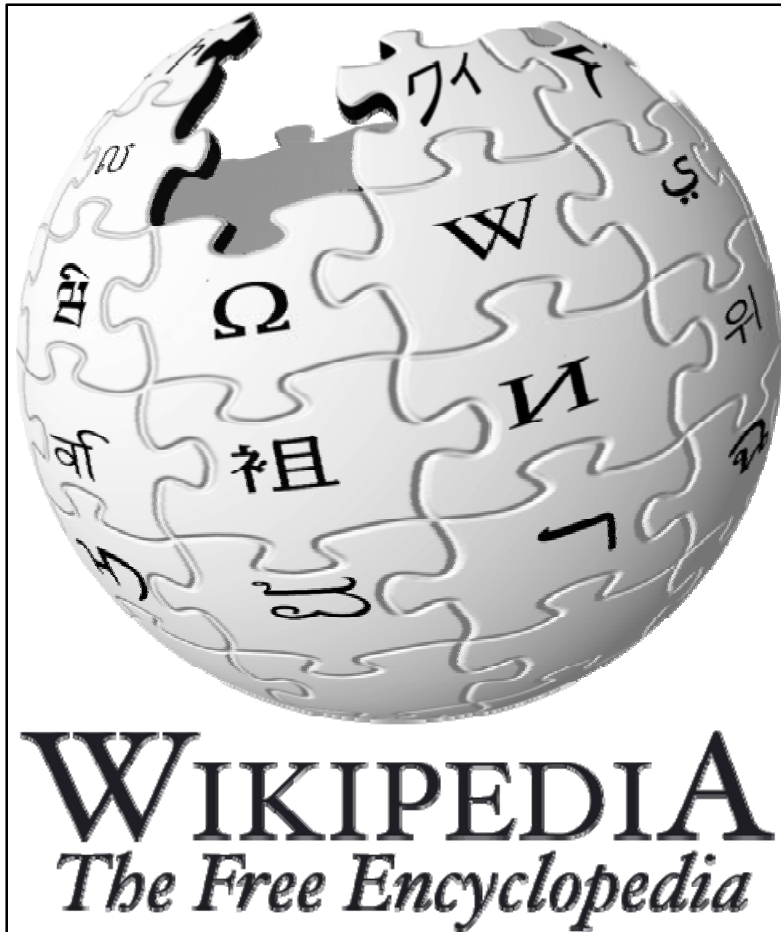
# Looking Back

# The Idea

- Built and sustained on donations – allows any one to contribute time, money and knowledge
- 5- 6<sup>th</sup> most trafficked site on the web
- Proprietary models of knowledge transfer have gone out of business
- Why has this happened?

# Continued

- Does the anonymity of the web make us feel safe?
- Does it rescue us from feeling embarrassed?
- Does technology enhance and support our need to connect?

**The top 20 sites on the web involved search and connection building, free and open sites available for almost every query**

# The Role of Frames

- Our interpretation of a situation, relationship, context or event
- Experiments in behavioral game theory - Wall Street Vs The Community Game
- What type of frame has wikipedia created and sustained?
- What actions by wikipedia could reduce the level of voluntary action?



# Excerpts of Thank You Letter

“You should know: your donation isn't just covering your own costs. The average donor is paying for his or her own use of Wikipedia, plus the costs of hundreds of other people. Your donation keeps Wikipedia available for an ambitious kid in Bangalore who's teaching herself computer programming. A middle-aged homemaker in Vienna who's just been diagnosed with Parkinson's disease. A novelist researching 1850s Britain. A 10-year-old in San Salvador who's just discovered Carl Sagan.”

# Continued

- There is an absence of rules and regulations in the wikipedia design
- Is there a possibility of manipulation ?- Free Riding & Defection
- What does the design / frame articulate to preserve order?
- **NORMS – NPOV(NUDGE VS PUSH)**
- Authors can summarise others materials but must always preserve the meaning and conclusions (WP: Synth)

# Continued

- How does the wikipedia design/ frame address conflicts?
- How would conflict be addressed in other organisational settings?
- Does it mean that cooperation requires self –governance ?
- Research on Public Goods Games – Elinor Ostrom, Ray Gardner and James Walker
- Wikipedia's frame allows us to discuss, debate, reinterpret and enforce on our own

# Continued

- The design creates a network effect and builds connections to nodes of knowledge – Six degree of separation and two degrees of influence
- Cooperation evolves and upgrades in this network – Repeated Games & confidence building
- The frame/ design creates an **EMERGENCE** – Research on norms and network density
- The end outcome is completely different from the constituent parts of the network
